The Wessex Museums project is a collaboration between the four 'Wessex' Museums - the Dorset Museum, Dorchester, Poole Museum, Salisbury Museum and the Wiltshire Museum, Devizes.

The four separate exhibitions take a fresh look at the life and literature of the Victorian novelist and poet in the stunning Wessex landscapes that shaped his view of the world.
