
The new Dorset Council Local Plan is proposing a huge development of 4000+ houses on the countryside north of Dorchester to meet government targets – NOT local needs.

Acceptance of this proposed development, described as a 'Garden Village', but in reality a sprawling urban development 25% bigger than new Poundbury, will have a lasting impact on Dorchester.

Why the community should oppose this development:

- Overwhelming demands on roads, hospital, schools, emergency and other local services
- Increased urbanisation of rural areas - at odds with Dorset Council's declared Climate and Ecological Emergency

- No guarantee of affordable/social housing
- Severe negative impact on heritage (Roman, Thomas Hardy etc.) and cultural assets (rich pre-historic landscape)
- Threat to water supply, likelihood of more flooding, problems associated with sewerage and pollution of the River Frome and Poole harbour
